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### Terms & Conditions for Beef Cattle Dept.

- 1. <u>Indiana State Fair General Terms and Conditions</u> By entering exhibits at the Indiana State Fair, you agree to the Indiana State Fair General Terms and Conditions on page 5.
  - a. All animals must meet the official health requirements, general terms and ownership conditions located in the front of the State Fair 4-H Entry Book. Pay particular attention to the terms and conditions on tampering, misrepresentation, conduct, drugs, pumping, forced fillings, etc. Officials reserve the right to require drug testing and examination of animals entered for show. 4-Hers and parent's consent to drug & tissue testing as a condition for entering. Refusing tests may be cause for disqualification.
  - b. Each animal entered in the following shows: Beef Cattle Department, Dairy Cattle Department, Swine Department, Sheep Department, Dairy Goat Department, Meat Type Goat Department must be listed on a 4-H Animal Affidavit to exhibit at the Indiana State Fair. The completed and notarized form must be turned into their respective department during check-in. Failure to complete and submit an affidavit as requested may result in disqualification of the animal, or the exhibitor from the Indiana State Fair.
- 2. <u>4-H County Terms and Conditions</u> For 4-H Animal Ownership, Possession and Exhibition Guidelines relative to State Fair Exhibition, see 4-H ANIMAL OWNERSHIP/POSSESSION AND EXHIBITION on page 22 of the Indiana State Fair 4-H Entry Book.
  - a. Only animals who are properly identified by April 1 (or earlier deadline set by county) for market steers and May 15 (or earlier deadline set by county) for commercial heifers, registered heifers and dairy feeder steers in Indiana 4-H Online (<a href="https://in.4honline.com">https://in.4honline.com</a>) are eligible for entry in the State Fair 4-H Beef Show. To be properly identified, market steers must have an 840-RFID tag and a 5-digit county tag in Indiana 4-H Online and submit a DNA hair sample to the county Extension office by April 1 or earlier deadline set by county. Commercial heifers and dairy feeder steers must have an 840-RFID and a 5-digit county tag and registered heifers must have an 840-RFID tag and tattoo in Indiana 4-H Online and submit a DNA hair sample to the county Extension office by May 15 or earlier deadline set by county.
  - b. After your county fair auction is completed, the Extension Educator will denote any animals that were purchased, sold or offered for sale after the ID deadline and prior to the Indiana State Fair (including animals that have gone through a "Premium Only Auction") in Indiana 4-H Online and shall not be eligible to show in the 4-H show at the Indiana State Fair. Sale of products of animals (milk, cheese, wool, etc.) in lieu of the animal, is considered equivalent to a "Premium Only Auction."
  - c. 4-H exhibitors may enroll a maximum of ten (10) market steers, ten (10) commercial heifers and ten (10) registered heifers.
- 3. NEW for 2018: To exhibit beef cattle, dairy cattle, swine, sheep, meat goats, dairy goats, poultry and rabbits, 4-H members must be certified through the Youth for the Quality Care of Animals program. This is an annual program that can be completed via online modules or in-person trainings. For more information about inperson trainings in your county, please contact your County Extension Office. More information about YQCA is available at http://yqca.org/.

- 4. Indiana Bred & Owned: Implemented to provide Indiana purebred seedstock producers with enhanced marketing opportunities while encouraging and incentivizing Indiana State Fair 4-H exhibitor participation. For animals to be eligible they must be Indiana bred and owned exclusively by residents of the State of Indiana. Must either be registered or certified by its national breed association or registry to provide proof that animal was bred within the State of Indiana. Breeder must nominate eligible animals through the Indiana State Fair Exhibitor's Corner online entry system by July 1, 2018. Complete Bred and Owned information available in the General Terms & Conditions.
- 5. <u>Dairy Feeder Steers</u> All dairy feeder steers must be 100% dairy blood but do not have to be registered animals. Crosses of beef and dairy breeds will not be allowed. A breed classification committee will evaluate all dairy feeder steers for 100% dairy breed characteristics. The decisions made by this committee will be final; however, the cattle barn Superintendent reserves the right to draw blood samples from steers whose dairy breed characteristics are in question by the committee.
  - a. The breed classification committee, veterinarians/department staff reserve the right to mark any animal(s)/animal(s) paperwork for a weight sift to enforce minimum weight requirements, failure to meet minimum weight requirements may prohibit an animal from showing.
  - b. 4-H exhibitors may enroll a maximum of six (6) dairy feeder steers.
  - c. No dairy feeder heifers will be allowed to show in this project.
  - d. All dairy feeder steers must be properly dehorned and castrated prior to the Indiana State Fair. Freshly dehorned and/or freshly castrated steers will not be allowed to show.
  - e. Dairy feeder steers will be shown according to weight. Feeder steers declared weight must be from 300 to 700 lbs. during check-in at the Indiana State Fair. At weighing, feeder steers actual weight must be at least 300 pounds and no more than 5% more than their declared weight or they will be disqualified. Steers sifted for weight may still be used in showmanship.
  - f. Declared weight cards for all dairy feeder steers are due in the 4-H office 1-hour after completion of dairy feeder steer weighing. Once turned in, cards cannot be changed.
  - g. The highest three (3) placing 4-H dairy feeder calves in each class will have their 840-RFID tag verified and re-weighed immediately following the placing of their class. Steers whose 840-RFID tag cannot be verified as the same from prior to May 15 will be disqualified.
  - h. Dairy feeder steers may not be groomed for showmanship or conformation classes; however, mineral oil and other grooming oils are permitted. Clipping of 4-H dairy feeder steers is optional, as is the use of showsticks.

### 6. <u>Declared Weight-</u> Declared weight system used for all steers and commercial heifers

a. Declared weight cards for all steers and commercial heifers are due in the 4-H office 1-hour after completion of dairy feeder steer weighing. Once turned in, cards cannot be changed. 4-H commercial heifers, steers, and dairy feeder steers whose weight increases by more than 5% from the declared entry weight to the show weight will be disqualified.

### 7. Terms and Conditions for Beef Exhibition -

- a. All 4-H exhibitors must tie their animals where they are assigned by the cattle department personnel. Due to scheduling changes, it may not be possible for 4-H'ers to tie animals in their open class stalls.
- b. A charge of \$25 will be assessed for each grooming chute and is required. A numbered chute sticker must be purchased through Exhibitor's Corner at time of entry.
- c. A \$5 fee will be charged for each outdoor tie-out space used by 4-H animals. Pay this fee when tie-outs are assigned during the stalling process.
- d. Cattle taken to and from the tie-outs must use the west door of the cattle barn by the milking parlor, but <u>only</u> during announced times. Tie-out times will be determined by the Superintendent. Times may vary daily depending on activities going on in the cattle barn, on the fairgrounds, or weather conditions. Once a tie-out time is announced, exhibitors will have 45 minutes to exit the barn.
- e. Stall dividers, gates and posts will not be allowed in Tie-outs
- f. False switches and the use of artificial hair are prohibited. Only natural hair growing in its original location will be permitted.
- g. All beef cattle must be dehorned and have no more than 3-inch scurs.
- h. Purebred and percentage breed heifers require breed registration certificates that must be presented to the breed manager at the time tattoos are checked on Thursday, stating that the exhibitor owns the animal exhibited as per ownership terms and conditions on or before the enrollment deadline and continuously until show date. See 4-H Steer Qualifications below regarding requirements for breed steers. To eligible to be show in a breed class, the ear tattoos must be legible and match both the tattoo entered in Indiana 4-H Online and the registration paper(s) for purebred heifers and some breed steers. Additionally, the 840-RFID tag number entered in Indiana 4-H Online must be verified.
- i. Only registration papers issued by the breed association will be accepted no photo copies or carbon copies and no FAX except a FAX directly from the national breed association to the Indiana State Fair

- cattle department personnel. Cattle that do not meet this requirement may be exhibited as Crossbreds/Commercial.
- j. Registered heifers that do not meet their breed's purity requirements as listed in the chart can only show as a commercial heifer if the tattoo and an 840-RFID tag number match Indiana 4-H Online and identity is confirmed on-site at the Indiana State Fair.
- k. Animal Identification- All beef animals must have a DNA hair sample submitted to the county Extension office by April 1 for market steers and May 15 for registered heifers, commercial heifers and dairy feeder steers (or earlier deadline set by county). Animals must have a readable ear tattoo identical to the one recorded on their registration certificate for breed cattle. Only one (1) number sequence per ear will be permitted. At check-in, any animal which does not have a legible tattoo corresponding to its registration certificate is ineligible to show in breed classes. Once disqualified from breed classes due to an incorrect or illegible tattoo, animals cannot be re-tattooed and rechecked. Likewise, new registration papers being sent by a breed association will not change the status of the disqualified animal. Only county issued, five-digit ear tags and 15 digit 840-RFID tags will be permitted. All other ear tags will be removed during the check-in process.
  - i. 4-H heifers, steers, and dairy feeder steers may not be shown with ear tags that display wording of any kind.
  - ii. The top 3 highest placing 4-H steers and Commercial heifers in each class will have their RFID tag verified and re-weighed immediately following the placing of their class. Animals whose 840-RFID tag cannot be verified as the same from prior to May 15 or whose weight increases by more than 5% from the declared entry weight to the show weight will be disqualified.
  - iii. Commercial heifers & Crossbred <u>steers</u> must have a 15 digit 840-RFID tag, and a 5-digit county tag by May 15 or earlier deadline set by county.
  - iv. The top three (3) highest placing <u>heifers</u> in each group will have their tattoos or 840-RFID tags verified. Heifers whose 840- RFID tags cannot be verified as the same from prior to May 15 or whose tattoos do not match their registration paper will be disqualified. The three (3) placing commercial heifers from each class will be re-weighed and any whose weight increases by more than 5% from the entry declared weight to the show weight will be disqualified. Once a heifer is selected as a champion it cannot be withdrawn from the show by the exhibitor. All heifers are subject to drug testing at the discretion of the State Fair and 4-H Youth Development officials.
- I. All Other Purebreds: Indiana State Fair recognized breeds (those listed in the 4-H entry book) are required to have a minimum of five (5 market animals and/or five (5) breeding animals in order to offer breed classes. ISF recognized breeds (those listed in the 4-H entry book) that have fewer than five (5) market and/or breeding animals will show in an AOP (ALL OTHER PUREBRED) class. Regardless of the number of animals in the AOP class, premiums will be offered for AOP division. The champion of the AOP division would be eligible for overall champion. Purebred or composite breeds NOT recognized by the Indiana State Fair 4-H Entry Book will NOT be considered for AOP classification.
- m. A beef steer or heifer identified in Indiana 4-H Online in a particular breed and sifted out, may be changed to the crossbred or commercial section before the scales are closed on Friday (at the end of Dairy Feeder Steer check-in). Animals that are disqualified for failing animal enrollment ID requirements (e.g. RFID tag, registration numbers, tattoos, birthdates, etc.); will not be allowed to show. A beef steer or heifer enrolled as a commercial or crossbred animal will not be allowed to switch to a purebred classification after May 15.
- n. Straw and sand will not be permitted in the cattle barn during the beef show.
- o. One overhead fan, will be allowed for each two (2) head of cattle. Fans must blow towards the exhibitor's halter side of the animal. Misters, butt fans, or fans larger than 24 inches in diameter are not allowed
- p. Fans must have proper safety-approved shrouds.
- q. Power washers are not allowed in the wash racks.
- r. Bulls are not allowed in the cattle barn during the 4-H beef show.
- s. Muzzles and electric prods are not allowed.

### Entry Information

- 1. All entries must be made in accordance with the terms and conditions.
- Online Entry To enter into the Indiana State Fair, please go to
   <u>www.exhibitorscorner.indianastatefair.com</u> and enter online. Each exhibitor is required to pay an
   entry fee at the time of entry. An exhibitor will not be considered entered into the Indiana State Fair
   until payment is made in full. Payment can be made online with a valid credit card.
- 3. **New:** An Unloading/Load Out permit, and 6 admission tickets will be included with the department fee. Purchasing of Parking Passes are optional and are sold separately through Exhibitor's Corner. Please see the unloading and load out permit FAQ at <a href="http://www.indianastatefair.com/state-fair/unloading-load-out-permits/">http://www.indianastatefair.com/state-fair/unloading-load-out-permits/</a> for more details.

4. Entry Deadlines and Fees - see below.

### Enter between March 20, 2018 – June 1, 2018

- 5. Confirmation of Entry A confirmation email will be sent once entries have been paid in full.
  - a. Exhibitors should bring their receipt received in the mail or if online entry electronic confirmation with them at the time of check-in. Confirmation of entries will not be made over the phone.
- 6. <u>Exhibitor Packets</u> Exhibitor packets will be mailed out by the Indiana State Fair Entry Department if entry is made prior to July 23.
  - a. Packets for entries made from July 23 July 31 will be mailed if there is sufficient return mail time.
  - b. Entering on July 23 or after payment will have to be made to get into the fair, then packets can be picked up in the Entry Office.
- 7. A 4-H beef exhibitor may enter and show up to six (6) market steers, six (6) breeding heifers and three (3) dairy feeder steers at the State Fair. These animals may be of the same or different breeds.
- 8. 4-Hers wishing to compete in open class must enter online under the open class department, pay all open class fees, and meet open class deadlines as listed in open class Entry Book.

### Arrival and Release Procedure

- 1. Upon arrival, all trucks and trailers should enter Gate 3 from 38th Street. In the event that the unloading area is filled, you will be directed to the 46th Street lot for number assignments. Trucks will be released by cattle and traffic departments as unloading spaces are available. Inside Gate 3, follow directions for unloading.
- 2. Animals must be inspected by designated department staff before unloading.
- 3. 4-H exhibitors will not be assessed a stall fee. Each 4-H animal will be assigned a stall by the State Fair personnel designated by the department superintendent. There may be a \$200 Exhibitor Fee assessed for cattle that are listed on the advanced stalling forms presented at pre-stalling and that do not show up for the 4-H show.
- 4. All 4-H trailers and trucks may be parked in the 46th Street Lot free of charge or in the reserved South 38th Street Lot. Some reserved spaces cost \$5.00 per day, per vehicle. Reserved parking can be purchased at the South 38th Street Lot when exhibitors arrive for the Fair. The reserve lot will be oversold. Therefore, as soon as your unloading has been completed, move your "rig" following the proper route designated by the traffic department. Trucks & trailer combination \$10.00 per day. Purchased exhibitor multi-day parking tag is for parking on Fairgrounds only.
- 5. Transportation will be provided for exhibitors from the 46th Street Lot to Gate 1 (main gate on 38th Street) and from the same location to the 46th Street Lot.
- 6. 4-H animals and exhibitors will be released after each individual breed has completed their show. Animals entered in the open show may stay over.

### 4-H Market Steer Qualifications-

- Beef steers will be shown by breed (including crossbred and other breeds) and according to declared weight.
   4-H members need to hand carry registration papers for steers to scale for confirmation of ownership against enrollment form. The minimum declared weight for steers will be 800 lbs. There will not be an upper weight limit for 4-H steers. Beef steers whose weight increases by more than 5% from the declared entry weight to the show weight will be disqualified.
  - a. The breed classification/sift committee, veterinarians/department staff reserve the right to mark any animal(s)/animal(s) paperwork for a weight sift to enforce minimum weight requirements, failure to meet minimum weight requirements may prohibit an animal from showing.
- 2. Dairy beef steers will be listed by declared weight only (not breeds).

- a. The breed classification/sift committee, veterinarians/department staff reserve the right to mark any animal(s)/animal(s) paperwork for a weight sift to enforce minimum weight requirements, failure to meet minimum weight requirements may prohibit an animal from showing.
- 3. The champion dairy beef steer will automatically qualify for the Indiana State Fair Celebration of Champions Award
- 4. There will be a maximum of 10 steers per class.
- 5. All Aberdeen Angus, Belted Galloway, Charolais, Chianina, Gelbvieh, Hereford, Limousin, Maine-Anjou, Red Angus, Red Poll, Salers, Santa Gertrudis, Shorthorn, and Simmental steers shown in the respective breed shows must be registered and must present valid registration from their national registries.
- 6. All purebred associations reserve the right to blood type or DNA test steers exhibited in their breed.
- 7. All Dairy beef must be 100% Dairy blood, but do not have to be registered animals.
- 8. Once a market steer is selected as a breed champion, it cannot be withdrawn from the show by the exhibitor. The State Fair and/or State 4-H officials require the grand, reserve grand and breed champion beef and dairy market steers (including the champion crossbreed steer) to be "harvested". Exhibitors of breed champion market steers, not selected for the Indiana State Fair Celebration Award, will receive live market value for their animal in addition to State Fair premium money.
- 9. <u>Breed Verification Screening Options-</u> All beef breeds (including dairy beef) may use one of the following four screening methods to ensure that steers meet the breed specifications listed in the 4-H Entry Book:
  - 1. Screen the steers utilizing a three-person breed classification committee (using classifiers appointed by the breed association and/or color) and require a registration certificate and a legible tattoo that is identical to the tattoo listed on the animal's registration paper. The Charolais, Hereford and Red Angus breeds will use this method.
  - 2. Screen the steers utilizing a three-person breed classification committee (using classifiers appointed by the breed association) and not require a registration certificate. The breed using this method is: Dairy beef. Dairy Steers/Feeder Steers sifted by screening committee will be eligible to show in a class by themselves but not eligible to receive premiums or show for champion.
  - 3. Require a registration certificate (that meets the breed's requirement for breed purity) for each steer and a legible tattoo identical to the tattoo listed on the animal's registration paper. Under this option, the departmental screening committee described previously would not screen steers for visual markings. The breeds using this method are: Chianina, Red Poll, Shorthorn, and Simmental.
  - 4. Require a registration certificate (that meets the breed's requirement for breed purity) for each steer and a legible tattoo identical to the tattoo listed on the animal's registration paper. Additional screening of steers for breed purity or paternity requirements (i.e. must be sired by a registered Limousin bull) would be accomplished using a form of biological testing (i.e. blood testing or DNA fingerprinting using blood or hair samples). Under this option, the screening committee described previously would not screen steers for visual markings. Under this option, the cattle barn Superintendent would disqualify a steer upon receiving notice that the animal in question had failed to blood type to the requirements of the breed association involved. The breeds using this method are: Angus, Gelbvieh, Limousin, Maine-Anjou, Santa Gertrudis and Shorthorn, Belted Galloway.

### 4-H Heifer Qualifications -

- 1. No more than two (2) heifers may be entered and shown per breed in the same age class. Age classes are:
  - a. Junior heifer calves born January 1 to March 31, 2018
  - b. Winter heifer calves born November 1 to December 31, 2017
  - c. Senior heifer calves born September 1 to October 31, 2017
  - d. Late summer yearling heifers born July 1 to August 31, 2017
  - e. Early summer yearling heifers born May 1 to June 30, 2017
  - f. Spring yearling heifers born March 1 to April 30, 2017
  - g. Junior yearling heifers born January 1 to February 29, 2017
  - h. Senior yearling heifers born September 1 to December 31, 2016
- 2. Within each age class of heifers, the following allotment will be used to determine the number of groups a breed may divide their heifers into:
  - 1 9 heifers = 1 group 28 36 heifers = 4 groups

10 - 18 heifers = 2 groups 37 - 45 heifers = 5 groups

19 - 27 heifers = 3 groups

3. Breed associations have the right to select division champions during their 4-H heifer show, but the breed association is responsible for any and all awards associated with these division champions. The following allotment will be used to determine the number of division champions a breed may select:

1-19 heifers	=	No Division	40-49 heifers	=	4 divisions
20-29 heifers	=	2 divisions	50 -59 heifers	=	5 divisions
30-39 heifers	=	3 divisions	60 or more heifers	=	6 divisions

- 4. Heifers in the commercial and other breeds heifer show will be divided into groups by declared weight rather than by age.
  - a. The breed classification/sift committee, veterinarians/department staff reserve the right to mark any animal(s)/animal(s) paperwork for a weight sift to enforce minimum weight requirements, failure to meet minimum weight requirements may prohibit an animal from showing.

### Beef Showmanship Qualifications

4-H members who participate in the State Fair 4-H beef showmanship classes may only show their own animals which will be exhibited by them in a regular State Fair 4-H class. Steers sifted for weight and exhibition breeds are eligible to show in showmanship. Showmanship will be judged on the training of the animal and the showmanship ability of the exhibitor. Animals <u>cannot</u> be fitted for beef showmanship classes. Exhibition breeds are eligible to show in showmanship.

- 1. ELIGIBILITY FOR SHOWMANSHIP
- 2. Each 4-H member who competes in the State Fair 4-H beef show may enter the beef showmanship contest by completing the showmanship entry on the State Fair entry form. Each breed will have showmanship classes, which will not exceed 20 participants per class. A 4-H member may only show in **one (1)** beef showmanship class or feeder steer class per year. The exhibitor may show either a steer or heifer in showmanship. The animal must be shown in the same section in showmanship as showing in breed. - 3. SHOWMANSHIP DIVISIONS. Grade in school on January 1 of the current year.

### Carcass Program Terms and Conditions

Enter all carcass animals under 403-CR-1.

- 1. The 4-H beef carcass contest is available for voluntary participation by those 4-H members who are eligible for and participate in the live portion of the 4-H Beef show at the State Fair. (If there is no packing company available at the time of the carcass contest, the program will be cancelled.)
- 2. All those participating in the 4-H carcass program will be assessed a non-refundable entry fee of \$15 when steers are weighed-in at the Indiana State Fair. The Indiana State Fair Beef Carcass Show COOL/Prohibited Feed and Antibiotics Affidavit will be completed at that time. The following terms and conditions apply to the 4-H beef carcass contest:
  - a) All carcasses will be evaluated for U.S.D.A. quality and yield grades.
  - b) All cattle and carcasses must pass U.S. Government inspection. Carcass value will be based upon quality grade, yield grade, carcass weight, and packer grid parameters.
  - c) Carcass data will be sent to the exhibitors by the Purdue State 4-H Office soon after the steers are harvested.
  - d) The executive committee will interpret all terms and conditions and will make decisions on any questions not

covered by the terms and conditions.

- e) The Country of Origin Labeling (COOL) affidavit must be completed and submitted for all animals entering the carcass program. Any violations to this and plant restrictions is at the expense of the exhibitor.
- 3. Only beef steers that weigh 1,000 to 1,550 (live weight) and dairy beef that weigh 1,000 to 1,650 lbs. (live weight) and less than 58" tall at hip will be accepted. For animals that weigh slightly under the minimum weight or over the maximum weight, one (1) immediate re-weigh will be allowed.
- 4. 4-H members must indicate at State Fair weigh-in time their wish to nominate market steers for the carcass program. Withdrawals must be made prior to the beginning of the 4-H market steer show. If more than the allowable number of steers are nominated, the market steers will be selected by the 4-H beef show manager from the eligible nominees. The number of steers allowed to go to the carcass contest will be announced at the time of weighing. The 4-H steers selected as breed champions or reserve breed champions will be eligible for the carcass contest. One (1) animal will be selected for each 4-H'er before a second is selected for any 4-H'er. The remaining animals will be determined by first withdrawing those animals with the lowest rates of gain.
- 5. Urine, saliva, tissue, and/or blood samples may be taken from any or all contest animals at the discretion of the beef department staff and/or fair officials.
- 6. Carcasses will compete within the same breed classification as they did in the live market steer show.
- 7. The first place carcass from each breed, regardless of number of entries in each breed classification, will be determined if any qualify, as well as the selection of an overall champion and overall reserve champion carcass. The respective second place entry behind the overall champion will compete for overall reserve champion honors.
- 8. In order to be named 1st or 2nd place carcass in a particular breed, the carcass must grade a minimum of low choice and have less than a 4.00 yield grade and must have an ADG of 2.0 pounds or greater.
- 9. Carcasses will be ranked 75% on comparative carcass value and 25% on carcass gain per day on test. (The test period is from the date the animal is weighed in the county until the day of weigh in at the Indiana State Fair.)
- 10. Participants will be paid for their animals on the basis of the hot carcass weight and the value of the carcass.
- 11. Transportation costs to get the 4-H carcass steers from the Indiana State Fair to the designated packing plant will be paid by the Indiana State Fair.
- 12. Note: All steers entered in the State Fair 4-H Beef Carcass program must be dehorned.

### 2018 Award Donors

Any monetary or non-monetary awards bestowed by outside associations, persons, industries, etc. are not paid or given through the Indiana State Fair.

The Indiana Angus Association will provide additional awards to the Champion 4-H Angus Steer, \$1000 and the Res. Champion 4-H Angus Steer \$500.

### Eligibility Requirements:

- 1) Must abide by all ISF Rules
- 2) Must abide by all American Angus Assoc. rules
- 3) Must be able to pass Purebred Angus Parentage DNA test.

The Indiana Hereford Association will award an additional \$500 to the exhibitor and \$500 to the breeder of the Champion Hoosier Heritage Hereford Heifer and \$500 to the exhibitor and \$500 to the breeder of the Champion Hoosier Heritage Hereford Steer. To be eligible for premiums, breeders and exhibitors must be current members of the Indiana Hereford Association. The Indiana Hereford Association is responsible for the remittance of these special premiums.

The Indiana Simmental Association will be providing extra prizes for Champion Heifer and Reserve Champion Heifer winners of the Simmental and Sim-Solution Divisions. These prizes will be announced at the Indiana State Fair prior to the respective shows and awarded at the conclusion of the respective shows.

STAR Bank will give a \$500 scholarship for the Grand & Reserve Grand Champion Market Steer.

Craig Sherbahn Memorial Fund will give Cash Awards to the Champion and Reserve Champion 4-H Junior Beef Showman & Champion and Reserve Champion 4-H Intermediate Beef Showman

Ron & Cindy Clauson will sponsor a plaque for Reserve Champion 4-H Dairy Beef.

Geri Newman will sponsor a plaque for Champion Light Weight Dairy Feeder Steer.

Brian Wuthrich Family will sponsor a plaque for Champion Middle Weight Dairy Feeder Steer.

Doug Western Family will sponsor a plaque for Champion Heavy Weight Dairy Feeder Steer.

Nila Armstrong will sponsor a plaque for Reserve Champion Feeder Calf.

The Dean F. Turner Memorial Award will be presented to the exhibitor of the Champion 4-H Dairy Steer.

The American Angus Association, 3201 Frederick Ave., St. Joseph, MO, will participate in premiums offered in individual classes for the junior Angus heifers, as included in its standard show classification according to the premium schedule based on the number of head shown. The premium assistance provided by the American Angus Association for participation in this show is in addition to the premiums offered by the show itself. The Association contributions will be distributed by the Indiana Angus Association.

A minimum of fifteen (15) head must be shown in the junior Angus heifer classes to receive American Angus Association premium participation. The show is not required to have all classes to be eligible for premiums.

To be eligible for Association premiums, the entries must be recorded in the sole name of the junior exhibitor and the issue date on the registration certificate must conform to the individual show's requirements regarding ownership.

Premiums from the Association are paid only to registered Angus cattle and only if the registration number is a part of the show report provided to the Association. Therefore, all cattle should be registered at the time of entry to make certain they receive the Association's portion of premiums. The Association does not pay on premiums offered in championship classes. An animal may only be counted one time toward the total count for premium participation by the Association.

Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate issued by the American Angus Association available for inspection at the show for each animal or another current proof of ownership issued by the American Angus Association pedigree look up. Any animal upon check-in which does not have a legible permanent identification mark (ear tattoo marks, freeze-branded marks or hot-branded marks) corresponding to the permanent identification mark on the registration certificate, is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible permanent identification mark, animals cannot be re-identified (tattooed/branded) and re-checked at the show.

Only one person at a time shall lead animals into the show ring.

Exhibitors who participate in shows that accept premium monies contributed by the American Angus Association are subject to the Association Rules as found in the Breeders Reference Guide of the Association. These rules are found in Part 2; Association Rules. The rules relating directly with the exhibition of Angus cattle are Part 2: Association Rules; Rule 800 Series; including Rule 800 - 810. These rules can be found at www.angus.org.

Altering the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the covering of white skin, false tail heads (or use of any false hair), with the exception of false tail switches. The use of graphite, powders, hemp or other similar substances used externally are also prohibited. Other prohibited products include those used internally such as steroids, illegal or unlicensed pharmaceuticals or artificial filling. Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing.

At any show for which the American Angus Association appropriates funds toward the payment of premiums, no exhibitors, individuals assisting exhibitors or member owners at such show shall be allowed to use any coloring agents, on any animal exhibited. The Association may adopt and implement various tests designed to monitor this prohibition, including but not limited to a "white towel" or "white glove" test. No aerosol cans or other pressurized containers will be allowed in designated make- up/line-up areas.

All animals exhibited are subject to DNA marker or blood type test to verify accuracy of parentage as covered under the Association Rules and for other testing as required by the individual show.

Authorized representatives of the Association have the authority to enforce the rules set forth herein as well as in the Association Rules, including the barring of a registered animal from a livestock show at which it is to be shown,

if there are reasonable grounds to believe a violation has occurred.
